

Our family has three different generations of adoption!



PARENTING

When we began dating, we worked hard to not impose on Charlie's time with his older daughters, Morgan and Gabi. This sometimes meant creatively scheduling dates for early morning workouts followed by coffee, or waiting until the girls were spending time with their mom on the weekends. When possible, we tried to include Morgan and Gabi in things we did together so that they felt valued in this new relationship. This family-centered approach is part of what helped us fall in love with one another. I saw Charlie as a devoted and extremely capable father who worked hard to love his daughters. Charlie saw in me someone who could be an integral part of the family, who took on the responsibilities of another parent, and who put the girls' needs above my own.

He has learned that his children's behavior is not necessarily a reflection of him and that they are sometimes free to make their own choices. He has also learned which battles are important to fight and which ones can slide so that the child is not constantly hearing that they are doing something wrong. I have worked for the same company for twentyseven years as a financial advisor. In the last year, I moved to a new role which has been so rewarding as I have become a critical part of families' lives to help give them advice that gives them peace of mind and security. One of the reasons I moved to my new role is because of the personal and professional balance it has allowed. My time is self-scheduled and has flexibility during the work day. It also allows me to work remotely 85% of the time. This has allowed me to dedicate more time to Stacey, Grayson, my counseling degree, and church. Additionally, my company has outstanding benefits such as six weeks paid time off annually, adoption financial assistance, and twelve weeks of paternity.

I am first and foremost a dedicated and intentional husband and dad so that is my priority in time spent. Next, is my church. I am a part of the Leadership Team at my church and help with the support of our pastors and church members. If I do have time just for myself, I am just over halfway through the completion of my Masters of Counseling degree - it's been more than an education as I have found all of the content of these classes to be incredibly ministering to me. You can also find me listening to music, which I find soul-quenching, reading books that are focused on spirituality, and consuming several hours of podcasts filled with sermons, parenting, counseling, and current events.





My childhood was hard and I didn't have any loving parental relationship beyond the age of eleven. My grandfather, who died when I was eleven, always spent time with me, took me camping and fishing, and took me everywhere he went. In many ways, after his death, I saw myself not just as unloved but as an outcast. Those circumstances formed me to become a present, genuine, loving father and I want to provide a life for my kids that produces in them a desire to love the outcast. At eighteen years old, I left my childhood home and town and became a firstgeneration college graduate, worked towards a successful career, married and built a family, helped hundreds of work associates start successful careers, remarried and extended my family, and always served others before myself.

I love being a dad! I raised my daughters as a single dad from the ages of nine and fourteen and wanted to give them a stable and loving home filled with my dedicated presence. I very much enjoy my adult relationships with my girls. I also absolutely love being a boy dad - to be a father again later in life has provided a way to be an even better, more intentional dad. I look forward to holding, loving, and raising another child with Stacey who will know peace, love, and joy. I also imagine the fun and loving interactions between our youngest and Grayson and her older sisters. I thoroughly enjoy being a mom - so much more than I even imagined I would. I have a special bond with Grayson. I've been surprised by many aspects of motherhood, not the least of which has been the immense love I feel for my son. It is because of this love that I can empathize with the thoughts, feelings, and worries you may be experiencing. While I can't possibly know exactly how you may be feeling right now, I can appreciate that your choice to consider adoption has been motivated by sheer love. Although I was around for part of Morgan and Gabi's childhoods, I missed out on their early, formative years and desire to raise a girl as well. I have felt for a long time that our family is not yet complete.

My mom and dad were amazing parents who did the best they could with what they knew and I always knew their love for me. However, in the process of seeking counseling over the last few years, I've learned that there are things I'd like to do differently with my children. I was raised to be tough, work hard, and never give up. These aren't bad things, but somewhere along the way, I internalized them to mean I couldn't express how I felt and I couldn't do things less than perfectly. I've learned the importance of naming my emotions so I can process them, accepting failure and imperfection, and not expecting unrealistic things from myself and others. I've started learning how I can do things differently in my own family now and I think this has helped me approach parenting in a healthier way.

SHOW PEACE, GRACE, AND MERCY


To us, this means that we try to be the peacemakers, where we and others are fully known, fully loved, and that we show ourselves and others love and mercy because every person including us was made in the image of God.
