OUR HEARTS FOR ADOPTION



We've always known we want a big family. Thankfully, we had zero issues getting pregnant and carrying our first two children. Unfortunately, we really struggled trying for a third. After over a year of trying and multiple early miscarriages, we were faced with the decision whether to pursue IVF or adoption. Early in our relationship we had discussions about hoping to adopt one day, we just were unsure of how that would unfold. As we prayed over and processed this decision, we felt such an overwhelming sense of peace and clarity. We felt God calling us toward adoption in this season. We decided not to pursue more aggressive fertility procedures and dive wholeheartedly into pursuing adoption. We shifted our entire focus toward adoption with enthusiasm and gratitude.



The seed of adoption was planted many years ago through various experiences and relationships. We believe adoption is beautiful and complex. We understand it is not how God chooses to build every family; we do believe it will be a part of how he expands ours. There is a unique longing in our hearts to open our home and our family to a baby not born to us. Equally important to us is the brave momma who carries them. Before we even started this process, we had many conversations about every facet of adoption – the many layers and emotions it entails. Several years ago we were able to connect with the child (now a grown adult) who Martha's mom placed for adoption many years ago. That relationship has been an unbelievable blessing and Lauren (Martha's half sister) has taught us quite a bit through her experience of being adopted.



We get to live life together and have over a decade of normal, unremarkable days spent laughing, being silly, and just hanging out. We are best friends and always prefer each other to the company of anyone else. Over the years, we have learned how each other thinks and the foundational truths each other believes about the world and ourselves. This has helped refine our approach to conflict. We are always making a deliberate effort to not judge each other and encourage intentional conversations about where we're struggling. We can confidently say that we have had years to practice being quick to forgive each other and show grace. We love modeling this for our kiddos too. We are far from perfect, but we are devoted to one another, and that allows for a strong and safe home environment.


